イギリス労働党のパンフレット、リーフレット等は、1900-1939年に出版された分がマ

イクロフィッシュ化されて、本学でも経済学部と本研究所が所蔵している。今回購入されたコレクションは、パンフレット、リーフレットからステッカー、集会チケット、党員証用紙までを含むオリジナルなものであり、戦後の部分に大きな比重がある。マイクロフィッシュ版と重なる1913-39年分でも、点検の結果、「無欠」のはずのマイクロ版に含まれない資料が本コレクション中に90点近く見出されるなど、決してその意義は低くない。

政党政治の「本家」イギリスにおいては、世界の動向をつかみ、国家政策の行方を占う上で、政党の出版物が第一次的に重要なデータとなるようである。本コレクションは、イギリス「福祉国家」を率先推進してきた労働党のなまの足跡であり、政党史研究にかぎらない諸方面の研究に大いに役立つことと期待される。

凡 例
